#### **Guidelines**

#### Extension

Manuscripts should not exceed 20 pages (except for tables which will be counted separately).

### Layout

If more extensive hieroglyphic passages are to be included in the manuscript, or if indentations and tabulators are used, please mind the shorter lines of the two-columned layout of the ZÄS. Tables and schemata may be printed in a single-columned layout.

For the sake of a balanced layout, please refrain from using too many different typefaces. Italicised passages should be restricted to emphases. Also please avoid italics in bibliographical references (apart from italics in quoted titles or in quotations).

Within the bibliographical references, the authors' names should be printed not in small capitals, but in spaced letters (s. below). Outside of bibliographical references, authors' names should be printed in the same format as the surrounding text.

# Hieroglyphs and transcription

The printing house of the ZÄS uses WinGlyph hieroglyphs, please observe the following settings:

Sign height 2.0 Line spacing 1.00 Scale 1.0 Line thickness 15

In case of hieroglyphic passages within the running text, please attach the WinGlyph codes as a separate text or WinGlyph file.

If you make use of other transcription fonts than "Transliteration" or "Umschrift", please submit them in conjunction with the manuscript.

### Coptic and Greek

"IFAOGrec Unicode" is the font taken for Coptic and Greek texts. If you should prefer other fonts, please feel free to attach them as a separate font to your manuscript.

#### Footnotes and bibliographical system

Footnote numbers precede punctuation marks.

Within the running text as well as within the footnotes, please use the following system for bibliographical references:

"Cf. Tefnin 1979b, 236 f."

and: "Tefnin (1979b, 55) considered ..."

The abbreviation l. c. can be used in case of repetition.

The manuscript should contain a separate bibliography:

# **Figures**

The author should hold the copyright or the permission to reproduce the pictures and drawings submitted.

Printed figures should contain a short title or number on the backside, the author's name and, if necessary, the designation "above" or "below". The titles of the figures should be attached to the manuscript. Electronic figures are best submitted with a resolution of 1200 dpi (monochrome) or with 600 dpi (polychrome) respectively.

## Acknowledgements

Acknowledgements will be printed at the end of the article. So please refrain from placing them into footnote 1, because their relocation would destroy cross-references in other footnotes.
